1. Activities reflecting the goals and objectives of the Institution:

The students from Ahmednagar and its adjoining areas particularly belonging to rural and economically weaker section are motivated to join the law courses to join legal profession. Efforts are made to equip the students with necessary skill to enter into the legal profession and to inculcate the sense of social and moral responsibility in them.

The college also organises Legal Literacy Campaign in remote areas with the help of the students through Legal Aid Camps. Organise the law awareness programme relating to daily facilities of livelihood.

The following efforts has been taken by the college to promote general / transferable skills among the students in order to reflect the goals and objectives of the college –

a) *Capacity to learn* –

The respective teachers suggest the students to read the books, periodical and journals available in the library regarding the particular subject. They are also advised and motivated to attend lectures of eminent personalities, to contribute articles in the journals, periodical, Newspapers etc.

b) *Communication skills* –

The college used to organise the speeches of experts on communication skills, they are encouraged to participate in Moot Courts, Debate and Elocution to improve communication skill.

c) *Use of Information Technology* –

The college has Information center, which is equipped with 15 computers with Internet facility. It also provides information through CDs regarding update decisions of High Court and Supreme Court. This center acts as a driving force and helps to accelerate the process of on-line information gathering and opened new avenues for research. Through Internet the students are able to get access to recent developments in the field of law and other relating fields. It also helps to the student online admissions and recruitment. This project is undertaken to accomplish one of the assurances given to the NAAC team to provide such type of facility to the students.

d) *Work as a part of a team and independently* –

The Socio-legal surveys are organised by organising groups of the students and they worked as a part of a team. Students action group is another experiment on the part of students to deal with certain issues concerning to the students.

In order to reflect the goals and objectives during this academic year our college going to conduct socio-legal survey in the following area: Human rights of under-trial prisoners etc.

The guest lectures are arranged to inculcate values amongst the students. The students are taught to learn moral values and ethics in the legal profession.

The students are encouraged to take part in environment preservation and protection, tree plantation, cleanliness drive, to participate in socio-legal survey and legal literacy campaign to inculcate civic responsibility among the student.

PLACEMENT CELL

Under the UGC XIth Plan college has established the Career and Counselling Cell under the co-ordination of Asst. Prof. Hirde G. A. Our Student Welfare Officer Asst. Prof. More A. L. assists this cell for collection of Bio-data of the students who are interested to attend the campus interview organised by the Board of Student Welfare, University Pune at the University Campus. During this academic year near about 25 Bio-data has been collected from the interested students and informed to the Pune University to consider their names in the campus interview.

This cell further assists the students to join the junior ship law practice with the senior advocates at the Ahmednagar District and Session Court and Taluka Courts by consulting the Senior Advocates from the Ahmednagar and Taluka Bar. Good number of students has been joined by the Senior Advocates not only from Ahmednagar but other adjacent Taluka Level Courts also.

During this academic year 5 students from our college has been selected in LPO at Pune.

Thus this placement cell has been playing good role in order to provide proper opportunities of practice and service not only in judicial field but in civil services also.

HEALTHY PRACTICES OF THE INSTITUTION

The following are the healthy practices are observed by the institution –

(a) Infrastructure

- 1) The college has a separate building with spacious classrooms with blackboards, podium and assembly hall with platform along with other teaching aids. The building is used to conduct regular University examinations.
- 2) The Library has adequate text and reference books, journals and periodicals, audio-video cassettes, current and back volumes of Law Reports, databases of Supreme Court and High Court cases and Central and State legislations. It is fully equipped to cater the needs of the students, staff and legal luminaries in Ahmednagar.
- 3) The college having a Information Center with fifteen computers is established with broadband internet connectivity to meet various academic needs of the students and staff.
- 4) A photo copy facility is available in the library for the students and staff to get photocopies of various references and other materials.
- 5) A generator and inverter backup is provided to ensure continuous electric supply to computers, classrooms and other equipments.
- 6) The institution has separate well-equipped Assembly Hall with a capacity of 350 students for its academic, co-curricular and extra-curricular activities. LCD projector and laptop can be set up in the Hall for presentations of resource persons.

- 7) A set of Audio cassettes is purchased to facilitate bridge course namely, Spoken English Course and DVDs are purchased for the reference to case laws. The college had procured a 'external hard disc' for storage of huge data of the college.
- 8) The college has constructed Moot Court Hall for the Moot Court presentation and practical training activity.

(b) Co-curricular
