The institution has recruited adequate number of faculty with required qualifications, knowledge and skills. The faculty is recruited as per the rules and regulations of the University Grants Commission, Government of Maharashtra, University of Pune, Pune and Bar Council of Maharashtra and Goa. They are paid salary, additional increments, provident fund, pension, etc. as per the norms of the Government. The changes effected through pay commissions or otherwise are implemented promptly. Study leave is granted to the faculty for research work under the fellowship of UGC.

Depending upon the workload and availability of candidates for the posts, part-time and adhoc faculty is recruited as per the norms, rules and regulations of Government of Maharashtra and University of Pune, Pune. They are paid as per the prevailing norms of the Government.

The college has entered into MoU with National Law School of India University, Bangalore regarding teaching, training and research. In the collaborative research programme the Ph.D. scholars of both institutions will have opportunity to make use of library resource of each other and to have academic interaction with the faculty. The research scholars and teaching faculty of both the institutions will explore the possibility of taking up collaborative research work and also apply for funding from National and International Agencies, Government and other funding agencies. In the year 2006-07 the college started the Study Center of Yashwantrao Chavan Maharashtra Open University, Nasik (YCMOU) by entering the MoU regarding Certificate Programme in Human Rights. Through this center the Research activity is done by 36 students in the area of Human Rights.

ICT

Five broadband Internet connections are available in the college. Broadband On-line and internet service of the library are accessed by students and staff through the computers in Information Center. Register is maintained which keeps the record of access to the students to the internet. The facility is available to staff and students during working hours of the college. The staff and students access the online and internet facilities as many times as per their requirement. The library working and operations are computerized with latest software including SOUL/OPAC.

The college conducts UG and PG law courses therefore college has established separate information center equipped with necessary software and hardware to enable the students to achieve competencies in computer operations and applications. The total number of computer is 28. The students' enrolment to the law courses is nearly 800. The Co-coordinator of the information center use to divide the students of all courses into convenient batches so as to enable them to access the information center properly. Therefore, the computer student ratio of 1:3 is maintained. In addition, library provided with net connectivity for easy access to students and faculty.
